FOSTER CARE – WE CARE

The Beulah Mission Committee has chosen as its next mission project to help the local Foster Care agencies with some of their needs. It has been brought to our attention that children in foster care often do not have suitcases or backpacks to carry their personal belongings with them when they move to foster homes. They often have to use garbage bags to transport their belongings. Imagine how you would feel if you had to carry your personal belongings in a garbage bag – like garbage?

Here’s your chance to help while cleaning out your closets and storage areas of gently used duffle bags and backpacks. Luggage is also welcomed, but duffle bags and backpacks are preferred because they are more age appropriate for the kids in foster care and easier to collapse and store away when not in use. Any donated luggage will also be put to use. In addition, there is always a need for new hygiene items (soap, body wash, deodorant, toothpaste, toothbrushes, shaving cream or gel, disposable razors, makeup, nail polish, perfume or cologne). We will take up a collection of these items as soon as church services resume until the end of summer.
