Scripture: Luke 2:1-7

In those days, a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He (Joseph) went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver the child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son, and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

Scripture: Luke 2:8-11

In that region, there were shepherds, living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, “Do not be afraid; for behold — I bring you good news of great joy for all the people. To you is born this day, in the city of David, a Savior, who is the messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth, and lying in a manger.” And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and singing: “Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth, peace among those whom he favors.”

Scripture: Luke 2:15-20 When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, “Now, let us go to Bethlehem, and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us.” So they hurried

and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told to them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words, and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

The Christmas Joy Offering will be collected at the Christmas Eve Candlelight Service (Dec 24 at 6:30 pm).

Did You Know?

- The Christmas Joy Offering has been a cherished Presbyterian tradition since the 1930s.
- The Offering distributes gifts equally to the Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions and to Presbyterian-related schools and colleges equipping communities of color.
- The Assistance Program provides critical financial support to church workers and their families.

- Presbyterian-related schools and colleges provide education and leadership development while nurturing racial and ethnic heritage. This has been a Presbyterian commitment for nearly 140 years.

Christmas Joy Offering Instructions

- *The Joy Offering shall be collected at the Christmas Eve service (Special envelopes shall be provided in the December 24th bulletins).*
 - **Cash Contributions** - *If your contribution is cash, it is important to use the Joy Offering envelopes. The **Joy Offering envelope** will ensure your contribution will go to the **Joy Offering** rather than the General Church Fund. By including your name, it will be added to your annual church contribution for special offerings (It is not counted toward your pledge).*
 - **Check Contributions** - *If your contribution is by check, it is important to designate **Joy Offering** in the memo field. The **Joy Offering** in the memo field will ensure your contribution will go to the **Joy Offering** rather than the General Church Fund.*
 - **Contributions taken on any December Sunday** - *If you are unable to attend the December 24th Christmas Eve Candlelight Service, you may make your contribution on any Sunday in December. If your contribution is by check, then put the designation of **Joy Offering** in the memo field or when using cash put in an envelope with the **Joy Offering** designation and your name. By including your name, it will be added to your annual church special offerings contribution (It is not counted toward your pledge).*
